Enhanced Application Support

CATS Cambridge students are offered thorough guidance on the university admissions process along with specialist support for applicants to the most competitive elite universities and courses such as Oxford and Cambridge. Through Year 12 and 13, we offer university application workshops, classes and mock interviews, allowing students to feel confident that they are submitting the best application they can. Beginning at GCSE, all students are encouraged to explore where their talents and interests lie, so that they can make an informed decision about their future study.



Elizabeth House is purpose-built for CATS students and is attached to the main building.


All rooms are single en-suite and offer shared social and common room spaces to make you feel at home. Darwin House is located on the CATS Cambridge campus. It is a five minute walk from the main teaching building.

There are 70 single en-suite bedrooms and 28 twin en-suite bedrooms. Each room has a comfortable bed, desk and wardrobe with ample storage for personal items. All bedrooms have a private en-suite bathroom.

Darwin House has its own common rooms and laundry rooms for student use. House Parents provide supervision 24 hours day. They offer the highest standard of care, welfare and supervision.

Students meeting the entry criteria will be accepted between September and January into A Level Year 1. After this point, students will be considered and admitted on a case by case basis. A Levels are the classic British path into higher education and offer an excellent route to study at high ranking UK universities. A Levels are a highly regarded qualification, and can open the widest choice of UK universities. At CATS Cambridge students can join Year 12 in both September and January to study for the A Level qualification.

OVERVIEW

A Levels are a focused qualification of three subjects and English studied over two years, with examinations in the second year.

At CATS Cambridge our A Level delivery is specifically designed for motivated students, with additional English language support to help them excel in their studies. We offer a wide range of subjects we work with each student to choose the best combination to achieve their university goals.

CATS Cambridge is an academically focused school with high expectations. Students will need to have demonstrated that they are meeting these expectations before progression to A Level Year 2 is confirmed.



Designed specifically for high achieving international students, the CATS University Foundation Programme (UFP) acts as a bridge from students' high school education in their own country to university in the UK. At CATS Cambridge we offer a UFP programme starting in both September and January.

OVFRVIFW

The UFP recognises the specific academic challenges that international students face and uses assessment strategies that offer the best opportunities to demonstrate a student's academic level and potential. Students each choose three academic subjects with exams at the end of the qualification. In addition, all students attend academic English classes designed to develop their English skills for university.

Final UFP grades are determined by exams as well as a significant amount of coursework which simulates the structure of most UK university courses.

Choosing a subject combination is important as universities look for students that have good grades in the right subjects. We work intensively with each student to choose the best combination to help achieve their university and career aspirations.

3 terms (September start) 2 terms (January start) Pre-A Level is designed as an introduction to the UK Further Education system and follows a similar approach to GCSE, but with a duration of one year or less. Students experience a wide range of subjects which prepares them to progress to study A Level, although this programme is also suitable for students wishing to progress to study UFP if they are of the appropriate age.

Pre-A Level offers students the opportunity to improve their English prior to moving to more advanced study and students should expect to take external exams in English and Maths. At CATS Cambridge, we offer both September and January starting points for Pre-A Level.



GCSE (two year programme)

The General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) provides students with a high-quality secondary education foundation, which offers progression to A Level or UFP. Students receive a strong foundation in their chosen subjects and are encouraged to explore where their academic interests lie. Classes are taught by subject specialists who are trained in how to teach students who have English as a second language.

CATS Cambridge offers one GCSE programme - the traditional two year GCSE programme.

GCSE

In the two year programme, students receive a comprehensive foundation in their chosen subjects. They develop a strong understanding of key topics and concepts and learn how to apply their knowledge and skills effectively. For the two year programme, students can join Year 10 in both September and January to start their studies.






